MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT

Our business, Fylde Electronic Laboratories Ltd is committed to combatting slavery and human trafficking in its business and supply chains, and we make this statement to assist with compliance with the Modern Slavery Act 2015. This statement relates to the financial year ending September 2022

As our business has a turnover of less than £36 million, we do not have a legal obligation to produce a modern slavery statement. However:

- a. We agree that exploitation within all supply chains ending in the UK is a blight on our society, and we are committed to playing our part in eliminating exploitation.
- b. We understand that customers with obligations under the Modern Slavery Act 2015 cannot comply with those duties without our cooperation.

To that end, we confirm that we have examined our own business and, to the extent that it is reasonably practicable, businesses within our supply chain and we confirm the following:

- a. We confirm that within our own business, no relevant offence relating to slavery or human tracking has been committed.
- b. We have made enquiries of businesses that supply directly to us, and we are confident that no relevant offence is committed in that business.
- c. Insofar as it was reasonably practicable, we have examined our supply chains and confirm that we found no evidence of slavery or human trafficking

Our business

For over fifty years Electronic Laboratories Ltd have been at the very forefront of analogue testing and measuring equipment. Our instruments are found in educational establishments, research centers, aerospace clusters, power generation systems, gas turbines, vehicle manufacturing plants, hydraulic valve factories and many more locations.

Our business structure consists of a single facility based at our site in Preston Lancashire. There are two directors, two managers and a small, dedicated team of designers and technicians.

All Fylde designed equipment is designed, built and maintained either at our Preston facility or locally based subcontractors .

We source components from OEM companies franchised distributors and trusted suppliers with a traceable and transparent approach to their supply chain.

Where it is reasonably practicable, we ensure that businesses in our supply chain have made a similar statement relating to slavery and human trafficking.

We encourage all employees to report on any matters relating to slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains of which they become aware.
